Crispus Attacks

The first man to die in this country in behalf of its liberty was Crispus Attucks—a Negro. Attucks led an unarmed attack upon the British constabulary in representing an assault upon a boy made by a sentinel. Hostile feeling against the soldiers existed several days prior to the outbreak on the morning of the 5th of March, 1770. A group of boys jeered and stoned the soldiers when a sentinel struck a boy with the butt of his musket. The boy reported it to Attucks and other American men near by. Armed with clubs and stones as weapons the men led by Attucks returned to the scene of the attack. The fighting began forthwith and resulted in a volley of fire from the soldiers' muskets. Attucks fell mortally wounded with twenty others. He was the first to die. This massacre of Americans created a deep feeling of resentment throughout the colony, culminating into open hostility of armed rebellion. The motive that resulted in the death of Attucks and his compeers was patriotic. They resented oppression and fought for liberty—for freedom. Crispus Attucks was born of a free Negro mother about 1720 at Farmington, Mass. His father was a Canaanian. At the time of his death, March 5th, 1770, he was about fifty years of age. The National Equal Rights League in requesting the race to observe the death of Crispus Attucks and the brave men who fell with him in the Boston massacre by fitting ceremony are rendering a patriotic service that should meet with unanimous approval.

Others Have Been Slaves

No, Negroes and Africans are not the only people who have been in slavery. A child got this impression from the manner in which his teacher spoke the other day in the classroom. The ancestors of practically every white group in America today were chattel slaves. There is no disgrace in the fact, little black boy, that members of your race were once slaves. It was blue-eyed Saxon slaves exposed for sale in the market of Rome that touched the heart of a great Christian missionary which resulted in the evangelization of the Saxons. Anglo-Saxons have been slaves, too, so don't be distressed, little black boy, when your teacher is talking about Negro slaves. Remember that other races have been slaves, too.

And They Say This Is a "White Man's Country" According to the latest available data, Negroes in the United States own 700,000 homes, conduct 70,000 business enterprises and have accumulated property valued in excess of \$1,500,000,000. This is being increased at an average rate of \$50,000,000 a year. The Negro operates over 1,000,000 farms. He owns more than 22,000,000 acres of land, and area greater than that of the five New England states of New Hampshire, Vermont, Massachusetts, Connecticut and Rhode Island. Although commonly regarded as being a tenant race, the records show that

one home out of every four occupied by Negroes (this includes those in the country and in the cities) is owned by the occupant. The latest available figures show there are 500 colleges and normal schools in the United States devoted exclusively to the education of the Negro. The value of all property devoted to the progress of higher education among Negroes is \$30,000,000. There are over 2,000,000 Negro children in public schools taught by over 44,000 colored school teachers. The Negro church property in the United States is valued at approximately \$10,000,000. There are 5,000,000 faithful communicants attending 50,000 Negro churches and nearly 3,000,000 Negro children regularly attending Sunday school. During the World War there were over 380,000 Negroes enlisted; 200,000 of these were in France and 42,000 of them were combat troops; 1400 Negroes were commissioned officers in the United States forces during the World War. According to the public declaration of the officers of the American expeditionary forces, the Negro soldiers made a magnificent record. This is further attested to by the fact that four whole Negro regiments and the entire first battalion of the 367th Infantry were awarded the Croix de Guerre by France. The trouble with prohibition enforcement seems to be that the juries are no better than the people. This plan of making the nations all one big family is a beautiful idea, if it isn't spoiled by casting Sam as the rich uncle.

Miller (white), of Ohio State University, in an address on "Why the Millennium Has Not Come", delivered at the Attucks Club "Douglass-Lincoln" banquet in an Eastern city last week, said after a lengthy discussion of race or group prejudices that it had not come "because we are such fools". An Englishman of intelligence and standing when told that an educated Afro-American of splendid character and means, who was as white in color as he, "was classed (mistreated) as a Negro in America", said: "What damned fools Americans must be on the race question."
