WINTER EGG CROP DEPENDS ON CARE

Johnson urges farmers to give their pullets good fall care if they expect to reap a goodly crop of eggs this winter.

Seasonable Suggestions in Caring for Chickens

During the summer months many farmers allow their chickens to shift for themselves most of the time, but with the coming of winter it is necessary that poultry be fed. Consequently it is doubly important that this feed is not wasted.

Poultry Facts

More than 65 per cent of the hen's egg is water. During heavy production the birds need very much more water than they do at any other time. Extra attention must be given to the drinking buckets during the winter months so that the hens will have a plentiful supply of fresh clean water available at all times.
