There is not a single living body of water to be found anywhere on this reservation. "33,00 Indians live on that reservation, 93 per cent of them are illiterate and in all these years only 400 have found the "Jesus Road."

But when it reached the Blackfeet, it had dwindled to the pitiful sum of \$3,000 and the emergency was over.
