This is interesting and is as it should be, for it is the only way to free our race in reality.

**COLORED VOTERS ON JOB**

Colored voters in Oregon are more deeply interested in next Tuesday's election than they have ever been known to be. Candidates of both parties are more than polite to them which is not unusual before an election.

Usually following an election each party candidate, or more correctly, their campaign managers claim the lion's share for the success of their candidates. How true this claim is, or these claims are, is problematical. But one thing is true, because of the great mix-up and misunderstanding within the Republican party in Oregon, no candidate for the office of United States Senator, Congressman or Governor can win without the colored vote. This one of the candidates and their managers seem to have realized. All of which brings us to the realization that the colored voter is a real factor in the political situation in the state. Mr. Brackney who says he is Publicly and Privately dry and a Protestant urged his hearers to vote 304 X Yes, and closed by asking the support of all the voters present of his candidacy.

**Oregon Is Regular and Ignored Progressivism Is the Big Issue**

**All western states Aided except Oregon**

Although one of the oldest of the Western states with unsurpassed natural resources and with the same class of people as her neighbor states, Oregon lags behind in the process of development. Compare with Washington. In 1880 Oregon had over twice the population of Washington. Today, Washington has over twice the population of Oregon. Washington has received millions for development where Oregon has received thousands. Washington is considered doubtful; Oregon safely republican.

In the last session of Congress both Oregon and Washington requested large appropriations for reclamation. Washington received millions while Oregon was handed a few thousand. Washington has been assured of seven new buildings, Oregon none. Washington received millions for their navy yard aviation fields, Camp Lewis and harbors. Oregon was given her usual pittance for harbors and otherwise ignored.

Washington has the system. When they seek an appropriation, Jones (Rep.) works upon the Republican senators, while Dill (Dem.) takes care of his associates. The result is they receive enough votes from the two groups to put over their appropriations. Oregon senators are both Republican. They can't reach the Democrats.

Every western state except Oregon has a bipartisan like Borah and Johnson, who are far from an congressional delegation or else extreme regular. They get things. Oregon is ignored.
