Delegate Reports

Special to Advocate (by Edgar Williams) On Sunday afternoon, July 29th, Rev. J. L. Caston, delegate to the 19th Annual Conference of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People, made his report to the local branch and friends at the Williams Avenue Branch Y. W. C. A. at 4 o'clock. Lee C. Anderson, president of the Branch presided over the meeting.

Dr. Caston gave a detailed account of the Conference and spoke of some of the outstanding cases that the Association had won during the year, many fighting segregation in all its forms. The report will be given in full later that you may give for yourself, he said: "As I sat and listened to the wonderful things the Association has done for the race, and the many big things that branches have done, and here the branch had not, it made me feel ashamed. We must succeed. This place should be filled this afternoon, but injected into this branch and able leadership must be recognized regardless of who it is. We must learn that if we are loyal to our race and conditions must be made better that our children might have a better chance to become educated, and a credit to the community."

I wonder if those present caught the vision? To make a leader you must first learn to follow. I want to follow but not the kind of leadership we have had. New blood in the local branch and back to the churches for the meetings, will solve the problem. Rev. Caston sounded the key note when he said "all lodges and churches must get behind the local branch for our own safety." Nothing beat a trial but a failure. Are you willing to try.

(Continued from page one) that Christianity is on the decline and has ceased to function as a vitalizing force human society. Among the things which they mention as pointing to the decadence of Christianity are blessing church at tending over doctrinal truths. The revolt of youth, prevalence of crime the slump in giving to church and Philanthropic agencies; The loss of the church's authority and influence and the gripping power of the worldly spirit. That these and baneful tendencies and indictments of spiritual disease may be admitted," he concluded, "but we deny that they represent a failure of Christianity. In face of tremendous temptations to make the Sabbath a day of pleasure it is inspiring to see the numbers who still attend the churches. While doctrines obtain wide attention, he main religious tenets are still tenaciously held by the multitudes.

If we decent citizens cry out in protest against the common habit of disloyalty to their oath of office that prevails in official America, we are accused of being influenced by foreign propagandists. If we protest against our public schools being used by the PRIVATE owners of public utility corporations as a field in which to teach the children that PUBLIC ownership is a dangerous vice and if we do not want to turn our schools into training camps in which the Army shall teach our children that killing other patriots' sons is the highest form of patriotism, we are called REBELS as they are.

Mr. Marvin is authority for the statement that the "greatest peace organization is our army and navy." Let me ask Mr. Marvin if he has a scientific reason for the adjustment of the unemployment problem through which peace and happiness will come to these out of works. If he has, now is the time to practice it.

Well, enough of the mouthings of this super-patriot. Incidentally, I should like to see the membership list of the organization that is paying his salary. It is easy to guess the names of many of them. I do not think they would qualify as friends of the common people. Let me tell you who Mme. Schwimmer is.

Who was about to kill an officer of the army? and when she said no, she would not kill anyone, he renounced "the application is denied." Therefore according to Fred Marvin she was still a "German spy and a Communist" and her opportunity to become an American citizen was gone.

But pacifists are not made of the kind of stuff that submits to such methods. Mme. Schwimmer appealed this Marvinitic decision and the Court of Appeals reversed it and directed that the petition for citizenship be granted. Let me quote from the decision:

"We do not have before us the case of a male applicant for admission who is able to bear arms and is within the usual conscription age, but the case of a woman fifty years of age. Women are considered incapable of bearing arms. Male persons of the age of appellant have not been compelled to do so. Appellant, if admitted, can not by any present law of the United States be compelled to bear arms. Judging by all the conscription acts of which we have knowledge, she never will be required to do so; yet she is denied admission to citizenship because she says she will not fight with her fists or carry a gun.

In other words, there is put to her an hypothetical question—what would she do under circumstances that never have occurred and probably never will occur—and upon her answers to this supposed case her petition is denied. A petitioner's rights are not to be determined by putting conundrums to her."
