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Brotherhood Calling on Portland Negroes to Be Men and Women of Purpose

Race Conference Called for May 30 and 31
 --Delegates Sought from Every Negro Organization in the City--"Strong Minds, Great Hearts, True Faith and Ready Hands" Called to Action--Unity of Racial Program Is Purpose of Meet--Prominent Local and Out-of-Town Speakers--Discussional Groups.

Know All Ye Negro Citizens of Portland:
 The first Annual Negro Race Conference for Portland will be held at the Public Library, Tenth and Yamhill Streets.

THURSDAY AND FRIDAY MAY 30 AND 31, 1929

The Conference will assemble in the Library Hall and will use three other rooms for discussional group meetings.

There will be two sessions each day, for the delegates, and one each night for the general public.

At least one national out-of-town leader in the economic struggle of the Race will be present and deliver one of the outstanding pronouncements of Conference.

The general theme of the Conference will be "The Combination of Negro Resources." The value of the same will appear when the delegates discuss "A United Religious Program for Portland"—"A United Civil Rights Program for Portland"—"A United Economic Program for Portland."

Delegates from every Negro organization in Portland will make up the Conference.

Every organization is entitled to three delegates, whose election will be certified to by the proper credentials.

All fraternal, civic and social societies, clubs, lodges, etc., are to be approached by four-minute speakers, and are urged to select their delegates at once.

The Conference will resolve itself into a laboratory and will issue its final program in the form of a proclamation, to which all of participating bodies will adhere.

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Rev. J. W. Anderson

is an ex-pastor and the builder of the Mt. Olivet Baptist Church—First and Schuyler Streets, Portland, Oregon, and is now Regional Secretary of the National Baptist U. S. A. Convention, District No. 2, comprising 28 States, and is transportation manager for said convention.

Rev. Anderson is considered one amongst the leading preachers of his denomination, having raised \$93,000.000 last year for home and churches. He owns a fine home at 429 Tillamook Street, Portland.

Rev. Anderson is the founder of the Baptist Denomination in British South America. He has been appointed twice as official delegate to the Interdenominational Ministers' Alliance of America by the Governor of Oregon.

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
