Famous Movie Star Will Forsake the Screen and Play Desdemona Opposite Paul Robson.

New York, Sept. 4-The question of whether Paul Robeson will play "Othello" in America has been settled insofar as finding a distinguished white woman actress to play Desdemona opposite him is concerned.

Lillian Gish, celebrated motion pic ture actress, who has been a screen leading woman 17 years, announced to newspapermen Saturday when she arrived from Europe aboard the French liner Paris that: "If his (Mr. Robeson's) 'Othello' is better than any other actor's, as I have heard, then, naturally, I would play in 'Othello' with him."
