## ABATEMENT ACTION IS TO BE DROPPED; PLACE TO BE RAZED

Abatement proceedings against the building at 523 Lovejoy street, long the resort of Roscoe McKnight, known to police as the "Black Duke of the North End," probably will be dropped soon, it was indicated Thursday.

The Security Savings and Trust Co., defendants in the abatement proceedings announced that the building along with two others would be razed. McKnight was recently sentenced to serve six months in jail. He was immediately admitted to bail pending appeal.

Suffering from a tropical disease, he is a patient at the Good Samaritan hospital, according to reports at central police headquarters. With his removal from the Lovejoy address, a police quarantine has been lifted.

state of Oregon.

"To preserve the present authority granted by congress to states and municipalities to acquire federal power sites for public development and use, thus insuring the people of Oregon control of one of greatest natural resources.

"To exclude soviet lumber and all goods wherever and whenever they are dumped into America to destroy our industries no matter what nation is the offender.

"To conserve and develop the great natural resources of Oregon through greater federal interest and aid.

"To improve the working conditions of federal employees where necessary in the interest of health, service and fairness.

"To relieve unemployment through restrictive immigration, increased public building, information and assistance and in sustained high wages during depressions; also through the protection of the toil of our laborers from competition with the cheap labor of alien lands.

"To preserve, improve and make more general the American standard of living among all the people of the United States.

"For an old-age pension.

"To encourage private interests to build up our American merchant marine.

"To insist upon a vigilant law enforcement.

"To urge the construction of a new \$2,000,000 veterans' home for Oregon; also for federal appropriations to increase the facilities of the present veterans' hospital in Portland.
