

Bell's Daughter Uses Model of First Telephone



When Sergius P. Grace, Assistant Vice President of the Bell Telephone Laboratories, lectured before a meeting of the National Geographic Society in Washington, he was assisted by Mrs. Gilbert Grosvenor, daughter of the telephone's inventor, Alexander Graham Bell. Speaking into a model of her father's invention which first successfully transmitted the human voice, Mrs. Grosvenor was clearly heard by the audience through modern amplifying devices. She is pictured holding the model of this historic instrument, while Mr. Grace is showing a piece of the actual wire over which speech was first transmitted and which was incorporated in a telephone circuit used for demonstration purposes that evening.

THE MOTION PICTURE SITUATION
(By Chester A. Lyon)

The Advocate does not necessarily share in the writer's views, but whether we do or not, the opinions are sane, logical and interesting. It is the readers' as well as our privilege to disagree with the writer who invites your opinion upon the subjects discussed from time to time in this column.

ARTICLE NO. 9
We have had many inquiries relative to how the Board of Motion Picture Censors is created in Portland. For the benefit of those who are not informed on the subject, will give the following facts, as taken from Ordinance No. 54457, Article XXXI, Section 1:
"An Ordinance on the regulation of private business, including licenses and declaring an emergency," passed by the Council December 21, 1921, as amended by Ordinance No. 42790 as follows:
ARTICLE XXXI
Motion Picture Censors
Section 1. Board—There is hereby created a Board of Motion Picture Censors to be composed of three members, at least one of whom shall be a woman, appointed as follows: The organization composed of those interested in the exhibition of motion pictures within the city shall submit to the Council in writing the names of three persons from which the Council shall elect one person to serve as a member of said board.
The Council shall elect a second member at large. The two members so elected shall thereupon select a third person for said board who shall be appointed as a member thereof by the Council.
If a vacancy occur in the membership of the said board, said vacancy shall be filled in accordance with the plan above provided.
Board members shall serve without compensation.
The members of the board first appointed shall serve until January 2, 1921, and until their successors are appointed and qualified. On January 2, 1931, or at the first regular Council meeting held thereafter, and every year thereafter, there shall be appointed in the manner above provided three members of said board to serve for the ensuing year and until their successors are appointed and qualified.
Next week the article will explain the duties of the Board, Secretary and Film Viewers.
