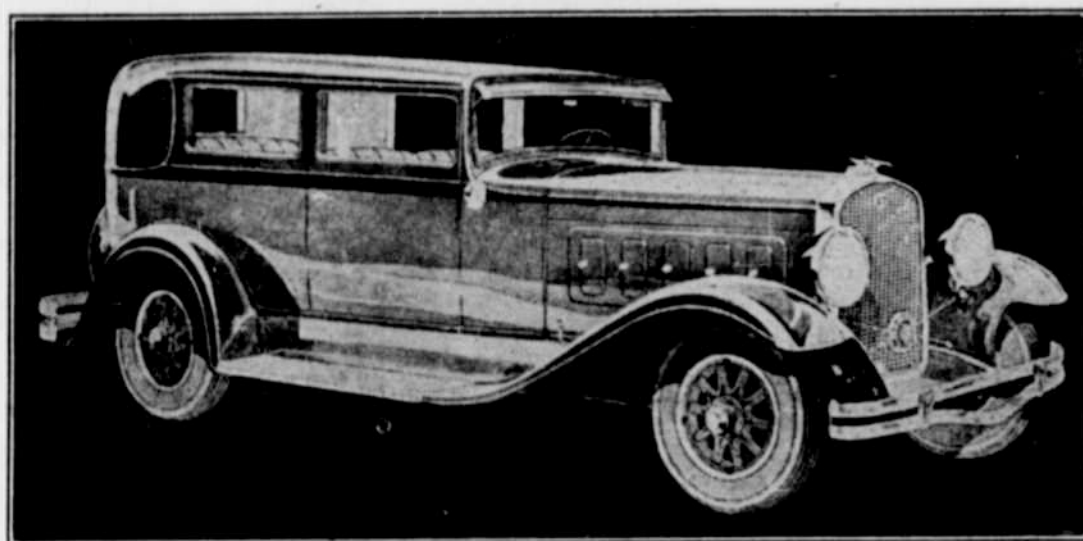

THE MOTION PICTURE SITUATION

The Advocate does not necessarily share in the writer's views, but whether we do or not, the opinions are sane, logical and interesting.

February 14th an appeal was made to District Attorney, Lotus L. Langley, to take action against a highly suggestive bill board picture advertising a certain motion picture, booked as a coming attraction at a local theater.

The District Attorney gave 100 per cent co-operation which was much appreciated.

When the owner of the theater learned a complaint would be filed regarding the poster in question, the following telegram was sent by him to me on February 16.

"I tried several times today to phone you, not reaching you. Very sorry any posters posted for me has caused so much discussion, however, want you know not altogether my fault as posters are ordered from the East in advance, delivered to Foster & Kleiser the day they go up and we do not even see until posted.

February 21st, a committee of Representative Business men had a meeting in District Attorney's office with theater men and motion picture board. The business men represented on this committee with me were: F. H. Plaisted, J. P. O'Hara, L. C. Wilkinson, Erwin A. Taft, Edward Laird Mills and H. R. Albee.

Censor Board promised co-operation from now on, and in the future, objections to posters or pictures will be put before the Censor Board.
