FOOD POISONING

Food poisonings may be caused any ways. Poisoning may result from ing as foods certain vegetables or mals which are in and of themselve onous. For example, certain fish re poisonous, thus not considered a dible. Other fish are poisonous durng spawning seasons. Certain specie f mushrooms are poisonous. Certain ungi are poisonous, while other mem pers of the same family are edible.

Peas, of a species of vetchlings, cans ervousness, with paralytic symptom Sour grass, a species of sorrel, cause evere gastric disturbances.

Foods may become poisonous due to he presence of chemical substances. These substances may be present accilentally as due to absorption from con ainers (canned goods, wines, beers, etc.) of certain metallic poisons-arsenic, lead, The Negro is not "New" or is there tin, etc. Other chemicals are added to foods to improve their appearance or o act as preservatives. Such causes of food poisonings are no longer common fue to efficiently enforced food laws.

Ptomain poisoning, contrary to the ublic opinion, is not commonly seen. Ptomain, which are end products of proteins (meats) are not so extremel oisonous as once was expected. Man ests have proven that these end prodcts do not cause the gastric disturbnces attributed to them. 
