S. E.: BLEEDING GUMS indicate that something is wrong, and it may be the first stage of pyorrhea. It may be due to a tartar accumulation on the teeth, which should be removed. Visit your dentist without delay.

G. S.: ALWAYS BEGIN at the crown of the head, brushing with a slow downward motion. Then brush underneath until every strand has been cleansed. Careful brushing done nightly for five or ten minutes will keep the hair glossy

G. N.: KEEP THE TEETH clean and there will be less likelihood of decay or gum infection. Two toothbrushes for alternate use are a necessity-not a luxury. Each brush should be allowed to dry before being used igain.
