### Gave Up Music **Publishing Game** to Become an Evangelist

When the Rev. Thomas Harten, Brooklyn's fighting parson, delivered his famous sermon on dogs at the Shiloh Baptist Church in Philadel-phia, two years ago he did not know that the Rev. William Pritchett was the audience.

In fact there wasn't any Rev. William Pritchett, evangelist ex-traordinary, lecturer and organizer of the American Citizens Associa-Two years ago there was only William Pritchett, publisher of torch songs, hot ditties and jingle jazz

But Pritchett, a dyed-in-the-wool sinner at that time, was there and he listened to Dr. Harten tell how New York in general and Harlem in particular, were going to hell because the people thought more of their dogs than they did of their

Pastor Harten also told how he was converted to the ministry, how he was thrown out of the gambling iouses that he used to frequent when he got on his knees to pray

All these things William Pritchett heard and all these things he di-gested and, try as he would, he could not get them off his mind.

Wrote Many Songs He went back to his publishing house and looked over some of the

songs he had written in company with his partner, August H. Perry. In the list he saw such titles as "Shake Your Blackbottom," which was made famous by Annie Bell on records for the Q.R.S. Corporation. There also was "Rock 'em Roxie," and several tunes popularized by Margaret Johnson for Okey records. There was "The Heavy Burden There was "The Heavy Burder Blues," the "Cut and Slash Blues" and many others.

There was also the number dedicated to the late Florence Mills. titled "She Gave Us the Sunshine in Song." There was also "She's My Sugar Baby Now." and "Tm Goin" to Buy a Coupe for My Baby." Pritchett, a tall gentleman of dig-nified bearing, thought about Harten more and more. "You look some-

more and more. "You look some-thing like him," said one hearer to Pritchett. And "you talk something like him," said another. And the Rev. William Pritchett

evolved. He stopped writing hot numbers and instead he and his partner started composing spirituals. They began to arrange hymns instead of songs and they started singing and preaching, and the Lord has blessed their work.
