BAILEY FOR JUDGE

J. O. Bailey, prominent in state political affairs for nearly 20 years, will seek the third department of the state supreme court bench.



J. O. Bailey, well-known in Oregon politics, who seeks a post on the state supreme court bench. He was elected to the state senate in 1928. Bailey has been active in legislative work. He was chairman of the joint Multnomah county delegation at the last session.

LABOR EDITOR OUT FOR LEGISLATURE

C. M. Rynerson, candidate for Republican nomination, State Representative from Multnomah County, is the editor and manager of the Oregon Labor Press since 1914 and has been in that position continuously ever since. He was a member of the State Reconstruction Commission following the World War.

WILSON H. SCOTT SEEKS JUDGSHIP

Wilson H. Scott, an attorney in the American Bank Bldg., and a Portland taxpayer for many years, is a candidate for the bench in department No. 2, Multnomah county district court.



With a good working knowledge of ores, rock structures, and other things pertaining to prospecting and mining, Mr. Scott proceeded to put this knowledge into active use. In Nevada where he started a successful mining career, he became acquainted with life in the raw, so to speak. He was in Goldfield almost at his birth and was elected secretary-treasurer of the Goldfield Townsite, and played an important part in its development.

COLONEL CLARK SEEKS U. S. SENATORSHIP

Colonel Alfred E. Clark, candidate on the Republican ticket for United States Senator. The Colonel is one of Oregon's outstanding attorneys and one who for many years has been conspicuously active in public affairs.

JUDGE EKWALL SEEKS REELECTION

Under the law passed by the Legislature in 1931, judges in Oregon are now elected without reference to political parties and without the use of a slogan on the ballot. Judge Ekwall was appointed to the Municipal bench of the city of Portland in April, 1922, succeeding Judge Roseman, who resigned at that time to accept an appointment as Circuit Judge, and who is now a Justice of the Oregon Supreme Court.
