

Household Hints

When sewing on a large number of buttons, use heavy, coarse thread. The work is accomplished in much less time than with fine thread.

When packing eggs, coat each egg thoroughly with lard and butter. Use a large stone jar and place the eggs small end downwards in layers of dry salt.

To reduce, avoid starchy foods and fats. Take plenty of exercise. Also take a hot bath followed by a cold bath twice a week, and do not drink water with meals.
