PORTLAND MAN FILES AS REPUBLICAN FOR CONGRESS

George S. Shepherd, Portland attorney, and ex-president of the Multnomah County Bar association, is a candidate for the republican nomination for representative in congress from this district. He mailed his declaration to Hal E. Hoss, secretary of state, late yesterday afternoon.

Mr. Shepherd is a congressional candidate in 1906 and again in 1914. "It is interesting," he observed yesterday, "to note that the things I fought for then have since come to pass."

His slogan will be: "Forty-foot channel to the sea. Real merchant marine. Practical monetary standards."

Mr. Shepherd, who lives at 444 Alsworth avenue, announced the following as his platform:

"A forty-foot channel from Portland to the sea."

"Radical reductions in the expenses of federal court appeals."

"Substantial and permanent river improvements."

"A scientific economic adjustment of produce values and a practical method of distribution."

"A real American merchant marine."

Mr. Shepherd, who is an ex-sailor, stresses a port and channel development as the most important foundation stone in a waterways city's growth, he said.

He is a historian and has led frequent expeditions into nearby regions searching for definite confirmation of early-day stories of the Oregon country.

Mr. Shepherd has also been before the voters as a candidate for the supreme court.
