JAMES W. CRAWFORD, Presiding Judge of the Circuit Court of Multnomah County, was born in Oregon 44 years ago, was admitted to the Oregon Bar 20 years ago, and is the son of the late A. M. Crawford, former Attorney General. He is married and has one child, and with the exception of 18 months in the army during the World war, has practiced law continuously in Portland since 1915. He graduated from Willamette University in 1911 and from Yale University Law School in 1915. 1913-15 served as First Assistant Attorney General of Oregon. In 1930 was elected State Senator from Multnomah County, receiving both Republican and Democratic nominations. As State Senator he was the author of the non-partisan judiciary law, co-author of the free text book law and of much other progressive legislation. In August, 1931, Governor Meier appointed him Circuit Judge for Multnomah County, Dept. 2, succeeding Robert G. Morrow, deceased, and he is now a candidate to succeed himself. Judge Crawford is Ex-president of the Oregon Bar association, trustee of Willamette University, active in affairs of the American Legion and a member of the Episcopal Church.

**MORE ABOUT BARBUR FOR CITY COMMISSIONER**

During the past year, he has, through the department, expended \$45,190,359.00 on new public work and maintenance. In the same period, there has passed through his office 463,923 permits for the construction of privately owned buildings, amounting to \$15,251,076.90. This vast expenditure of money has been carried on without a single question as to his efficiency and honesty.

Mr. Barbur voted against the telephone franchise for the reason that it did not provide for reduced telephone rates. The State of Oregon is now investigating the City rates and is working toward a reduction, and it is his contention that the City should not give the telephone company the right to use the streets until the State has fixed the toll that is to be charged.

In other words, the City and the State have entered into an agreement to investigate the telephone situation with a view of reducing rates. Therefore, it is his opinion that it would not be fair for the city to give the company the right to use its streets, alleys and highways for the placing of poles and conduits, which the City has agreed to grant, and leave the franchise blank as to the charge to be made by the company. He is perfectly willing to give the telephone company a franchise provided a reduction in rates is given but not otherwise.

The right of way for the Fourth Street Extension to the city limits, comprising approximately 170—50' x 100' lots valued at approximately \$200,000.00, was secured personally by Mr. Barbur free of cost to the city. Through Mr. Barbur's efforts, the Secret Service Fund of the City was reduced \$11,000.00 in 1932—another saving to the taxpayers.

Mr. Barbur was the first public official to call attention to the method pursued by the Portland Electric Power Company in the transfer of its stock to a holding company known as the Central Public Service Corporation, which matter is now being investigated by the State of Oregon at his request.

Mr. Barbur, over two years ago, commenced work on the unification of switching of all railroads doing business in the City of Portland. This matter is progressing rapidly and will mean a saving of many thousands of dollars to merchants and shippers in our city. All Mr. Barbur's savings during his term of office have been investigated and restated in the City of Portland. He believes in Portland, and, if elected in November, will continue as in the past. His slogan is—"Efficiency, economy, experience and honesty in public office."
