## TION FOR ARMY CAMPS

WASHINGTON, March 8 - (ANP) When the United States Senate voted ANOTHER TWENTY-FOUR HRS. to support the amendment of Senator James Couzens to the army appropri ation bill, to set aside \$22,000,000 extra for the Citizens' Military Training Camps, the National Council for the Prevention of War immediately launched an offensive against this amendment as an unnecessary expenditure under the present economic conditions.

One of the issues raised against the Couzens' amendment was to the effect that Negroes are denied admission to the Citizens' Military Training

Senator Couzens had stated that this money could be used to take homeless boys off the street, but Mary Ida Winder, associate secretary of the peace organizations, points out that colored boys would be denied the advantages that might accrue from such a provision and that if it were made, it would be less likely that relief measures in which they could share would
