Mix and sift dry ingredients. Beat the egg, add the milk, and stir gradthe melted fat, then the bananas, and drop by spoonfuls on a hot griddle. Cook on one side until full of bubbles. turn, and cook on the other side.

Roll half lengths of peeled bananas in strips of bacon. Secure with tooth pick, if necessary. Broil under flame or bake in oven-proof dish in a hot oven, 450° F., about fifteen minutes. or until bananas are tender and bacon is crisp. Baste at least once during be wrapped in bacon and cooked in
