Mrs. Abbott Gets \$50,000 In Surprise Settlement of Case

Chicago, Ill., July 6.—The Abbots are now divorced. The decree was signed in the courtroom of Judge Philip J. Finnegan Saturday. By terms of the settlement immediately preceding the grant of the divorce gave Mrs. Helen Thornton Abbott a Pierce Arrow automobile, \$50,000 in cash, silverware and other household effects and an additional \$2,500 for attorney fees.

The possibility of divorce and settlement was discussed Tuesday by the rival attorneys and these conferences took up until Saturday. After court, Mrs. Abbott moved from the handsomely furnished house at 4742 South Parkway to an apartment in the Rosenebud building. Later that afternoon Editor Abbott returned to his home from whence he has been absent since May, 1932. The two had lived there eight years.

Mr. McGill was pleased at the outcome of the case. It is said that some of the charges made against him have made him fidgety and has caused him to state that he has not been fairly represented. All the transactions in which he has been involved have been open and above board claims and has stated on many occasions that his sole interest was to protect the interests of Mr. Abbott in the Abbott publications.

Attorney Robert E. Cantwell, Jr., counsel for Mrs. Abbott received the check for \$52,000 in behalf of his client. A signed statement was executed by Mrs. Abbott prior to her receiving the money and another was signed by N. K. McGill in order to remove any attempt of litigation between Mrs. Abbott and himself following the divorce.

The case began in May, 1932, when Mrs. Abbott filed suit for separate maintenance after her husband had been away from her for ten days. The case was heard in court in the months of July and November, 1932. (Reprinted from the Chicago Bee)
