Mr. Puhl can not speak English at all and he took this job with Mr. Neuber's road builders so as to be with Americans so as to more quickly learn our language.

Miss Ella Hoover went to Medford last Sunday expecting to take charge of her mother's house while the latter went on a visit to a sister in Texas, but Monday Mrs. Hoover received a telegram stating that her sister had decided to come to Oregon. Owing to this change in her sister's plans Mrs. Hoover will not make her trip and Miss Ella will return in about 10 days to her place in the Jacksonville millinery parlors.

Ashland capitalists are branching out with their investments and a company composed of D. B. Provost, L. L. Mulit, J. L. Fenton and T. E. Hills has been organized in that city to put in a national bank at Condon, the county seat of Gilliam county. Condon is at present without banking facilities, and being a growing town in the midst of a great grain and stock district, offers good inducements to a bank.

A five-stamp mill and considerable other machinery has been installed at the Bowden quartz mine, of the Gold Hill district. This property, which has been mined in a desultory way for several years past, and which has produced many fortunes as a "pocket proposition," has been making rapid progress during the past year under the efficient management of the Bowden Gold Mining Company, of Los Angeles. They have run a number of tunnels and shafts and exposed a fine ore body. The new mill will be set to work at once and kept in continued operation.

Yreka city authorities will shortly let the contract to put in a gravity water system for that city. The pipe line will be three miles long extending from the headworks in a canyon back of the town to a reservoir. Though the water supply is not so very large it is expected that with a large reservoir for storage purposes that there will be ample water for all the needs of the city. In addition to affording a good supply of pure water, the new water system will have a big pressure, which will give better fire protection than the town has heretofore had.

E. F. Brickley left Wednesday for the Applegate copper district with an outfit of tools and grub to take up the work of developing a copper claim he has recently located on Squaw creek. Mr. Brickley's claim is in the vicinity of the famous Blue Ledge mine that is showing up such rich prospects, and he has every reason to believe that his claim will be equally as valuable. The ledge upon which he has located his claim is 30 feet wide and the surface indications are quite as good as those were of the other mines in that district. Mr. Brickley will spend about a month on this trip to his claim.

SOWELL SMELTER ALMOST READY—The big smelter out at the Sowell copper mines in the Waldo district is to be "blown in" and started up in the course of a few days. These mines are owned by the Mountain View Copper Company. They were discovered and developed to a considerable extent by Sowell Brothers, but something over a year ago they were purchased by the Mountain View Company. These people went industriously to work developing the mines and removing ore. As a result they now have enough rich copper ore on the dump to keep the new smelter in operation continuously. The ledges have been opened to a good depth and carry excellent values in copper, aside from very fair values in gold. In fact, much of the ore carries enough gold to pay for the cost of mining and smelting it. The question of transportation, which has long puzzled and retarded the progress of this as well as other copper mines of the Waldo district, they hope to have settled this summer by the construction of the Oregon & Pacific Railroad, which line will pass directly through the center of the Waldo district. The Waldo Smelting & Mining Company are preparing to put their mines to work at an early date. A large force of men will be employed, removing ore, making ready for the large

smelter that is to be installed with the completion of the Oregon & Pacific.

SOUTHERN PACIFIC HELPS ON STREET WORK—The S. P. Co. is placing from four to five cars of gravel per day here now, and the city has men busy filling in and grading near the depot. At this rate it will only take a short time for the necessary amount to be placed and the towns eyesore will then be removed.—Gold Hill News.
