Jacksonville Continues to Win.

The Jacksonville nine added a clincher to their claim to the championship of Southern Oregon when on last Sunday afternoon they defeated the Medford team by a score of 4 to 3 and gave the large crowd of spectators a most excellent exhibition of the national game, at the same time sending the lusty Medford rooters home with meek and humble countenances. The Medford band was in attendance and played good selections during the game but all eyes and ears were intent upon the diamond where the contest was hard fought throughout. Medford was first to bat but neither side scored till the third inning, when the visitors tallied once and the home team twice. The game began to look as like a one sided affair but Medford tallied in the 6th and 7th tying the score. Jacksonville, however, held them down for the last two innings and by some exciting work scored the winning run in the last of the ninth. A number of errors were made on both sides but were more than offset by brilliant plays, noticeably a double when Pat Donegan fielded a grounder at third, threw to Barlow who shut out a tally aspirant at home plate then sent the ball to second where Gale winged a Medfordite coming from first. Jacksonville's victory was due to conscientious work by the whole team. In fact since Manager Ingram assumed control, he and Capt. Donegan have worked together so harmoniously and effectively that the team has played with confidence and consequent victory. Umpire Robley gave general satisfaction.
