The Destructive Coddling Moth.

Secretary of Agriculture Wilson estimates that the coddling moth has done about \$23,000,000 worth of damage to the apple industry in the United States during the past year, which is a loss of \$3,000,000 more than in the last four years. The secretary believes that one-fourth more apples would have been placed on the market had it not been for the coddling moth, or about 12,000,000 barrels. The loss in home orchards, in which the percentage is far greater than in commercial orchards, is estimated at \$3,000,000. These estimates have been reached after a thorough investigation of the apple industry in the United States by C. B. Simpson, of the division of entomology, who has been engaged in experiments for the past two years. Secretary Wilson regards the coddling moth as undoubtedly the most destructive insect pest of the apple and pear and the occasion of greater loss than all the other insect enemies of these fruits combined, entailing an annual shrinkage of values exceeding \$20,000,000.
