Jacksonville School Library.

Last year after the school house had been destroyed by fire the company of Volunteer Firemen raised a generous sum of money by popular subscription and a public ball and after supplying a large number of children with text-books and supplies with a portion of this money they decided to purchase books for the school library with the remainder which was over a hundred dollars. A committee was appointed to expend this money and it first purchased a Century Dictionary and Cyclopaedia bound in three-quarter Morocco and was fortunate enough to get this at a big discount. Recognizing the value of historical and biographical works in the formation of character and the need of them to successfully study history and civics in the advanced grades, the committee purchased a large number of these works as the nucleus of a library. Forty volumes have been placed in the library for the use of the advanced grades in the school and twenty-five volumes for the primary department. Oregon Hog Law.

Several inquiries have been received by the Review recently as to whether there is a hog law in effect at the present time in Douglas county. The matter was referred to Dist. Atty. G. M. Brown, who assures us that there is such a law now in effect. The various legislative enactments in regard to restrictions against livestock of the various kinds running at large in this state, and the procedures and penalties thereto, are quite extensive and cover a considerable period of time. Relating to swine, the statutes, as given in Bellinger and Cotton's Code, include the following:

Sec. 4242. A person finding any swine running at large contrary to the provisions of this act, and any constable of any precinct or marshal of any city of his county where such swine may be found, on view or information, shall take up and confine the same forthwith, giving notice thereof to the owner, if known, and if not known, by posting notices, describing such animals therein, in at least three public places within the precinct; and if the owner does not appear and claim his property and pay all charges for taking up, advertising, and keeping the same within ten days from the date of this notice, the sale of the animals may be proceeded with under the law relating to estrays.—Roseburg Review.

The big ditch that is to bring water from Fish lake up near Mt. Pitt to irrigate the desert lands near Rogue River is now completed from Fish lake to Yankee creek and the earth work is completed from Yankee creek on to Antelope creek and so soon as a section of about 1500 feet of flume is put in to carry water across the Yankee creek valley, the flume will be ready to carry water from the Lake to the Antelope valley. George Morris has retired as superintendent and B. C. McCray is now in charge of the construction gang which numbers from ten to fifteen men.
