paid their taxes: If you pay your taxes before March 15 you cent.
If you pay your taxes between March 15th and up to and including the first Monday in April, there will not be an

If your taxes are not paid on or before the first Monday of April, they will be come delinquent when there will be
added a penalty of 10 per cent, and the tax will also draw interest at the rate of 12 per cent per annum in addition to the
penalty. If you pay one-half of your taxes, o
or before the first Monday in April the the remaining half may run up to and following; but if the last half of tax due is not paid by the first Monday of Octo ber it becomes delinquent, and there wil be added to such balance, a penalty of 10 per cent, and in addition such will bear
interest at the rate of 12 per cent per annum from the first Monday in April until paid.
half is personal property taxes, if one half is not paid on or before the firs sheriff to levy upon and collect the same after May 1st, hence to prevent a levy will be necessary for one-half to be paid as above stated.
The law compels the sheriff to sell all lands on which taxes have not been paid and that such sale shall not be held later than March 1st of the year succeedin The property will be sold to the person bidding the lowest rate of interest, and certificates will be issued therefor, an deeds given to such property sold, unless redeemed within three years from the date of such sale.
