

Republican State Convention.

A meeting of the Republican state central committee was held in Portland last Friday. Hon. Theo. Cameron, member for Jackson county, was unable to attend and he gave his proxy to Hon. H. E. Ankeny, who attended the committee meeting.

It was decided to hold the state convention in Portland on April 14. April 2d was recommended as a date for holding primary meetings throughout the state and April 7th for county conventions.

The state convention will consist of 361 delegates and the apportionment is based on the Republican vote for R. S. Bean for supreme judge in 1902, allowing one delegate for each 150 votes and one additional delegate for each fraction thereof over 100 and one delegate at large to each county. It follows:

The committee decided that the State Convention can well be held later than usual this year, in as much as the campaign need not be long. The law requires nominees to file their acceptance of nomination at least 45 days before the election.

The nominations will be:
Supreme Judge.
Dairy and Food Commissioner.
Four Presidential electors.

Eight delegates to the National Convention at Chicago June 21; four at large and two for each congressional district and eight alternates.

The dates recommended for primaries and county conventions are not binding on the county organizations but are usually adhered to by the local committees.
