Miss Bernice Cameron was in Jacksonville Monday from Uniontown on her way to Medford to spend a few days with her sister, Mrs. Lee Jacobs and her brother, Dr. W. L. Cameron.

N. S. Bennett, a photographer of Medford, arrived in the city Saturday on his way to Crater Lake where he expects to get some fine pictures of winter scenery around the lake.—Klamath Falls Republican.

Capt. O. C. Applegate informs us that he was officially notified yesterday that the government had approved the right of way for the proposed telephone and telegraph line of L. Hessig, through the reservation from Fort Klamath to Klamath Falls. Mr. Hessig has the poles all ready and the work will be rushed. Mr. Applegate has also submitted a proposition to the Indian Department, to build a connecting line between the Agency and Yainax.—Klamath Falls Republican.

S. H. Munson, one of the best known and highly respected citizens of Edenville, was committed to the state insane asylum by the county court yesterday and last night was taken to Salem by Sheriff Parrot. Mr. Munson's form of insanity is said to consist of brain softening, due to an illness from which he partially recovered physically several months ago. His wife and two sons and daughter brought the complaint, testifying that Mr. Munson had homicidal tendencies. Apparently he never exhibited such tendency outside of his own home. A very slight mental weakness was noticeable, but this did not in the least affect his almost perfectly rational manner, when he made his usual daily walks into town. His commitment is therefore the occasion of painful surprise and regret among his many friends.—Roseburg Review. Mr. Munson is well known in Jackson county, he having traveled extensively over the county as a Sunday School missionary worker, and he has many friends here who will hope for his early restoration to health.

H. Von der Hellen, a leading farmer and stockman of Antelope Valley, was in Jacksonville Monday to pay his taxes and attend to some other business matters at the courthouse. Mr. Von der Hellen has been mentioned quite prominently of late as an eligible candidate for county judge on the Republican ticket. As to his candidacy Mr. Von der Hellen stated that he was not a candidate and would make no effort for the nomination, yet if his friends saw fit to secure him the nomination he would accept the honor and would do his part in the campaign to secure success to the Republican ticket, and if elected would give close attention to the duties of the county judge. Mr. Van der Hellen is a strong advocate of good roads, he favoring the plan that the county commence at the railroad shipping points and build substantial, permanent macadamized roads toward the outlying districts. Building as far each year as the road fund would permit. As to methods of road building Mr. Von der Hellen holds that Jackson county should profit by the experience of the Eastern states and of Europe where road building has been reduced to a science and build roads that would be permanent. To attain this result he would favor the county completing its road working plant of a grader and a rock crusher by adding a large steam road roller, for it has been proven by long experience in road work that a road may be ever so well be graded and covered with loose rock that it will not become a passable, permanent road unless it is rolled, and rolled in layers as the earth and rock are added to build up the turnpike. A loose earth foundation with unscrened, loose rock thrown upon it will not give a solid road for it will soon settle and become a series of high and low places, but little improvement over the old mud road.
