

**Few Votes Registered.**

Registration of voters is proceeding very slowly and up to Thursday of this week but 1510 names had been filed with County Clerk Orth. As there are above 4500 votes in Jackson county and the registry books close May 15 there will have to be a hurrying up in the registering or a large number of voters will be put to the great inconvenience of securing six freeholders to swear in their vote for them on election day. This registration will hold for two years and the books will not again be open until March, 1906 and those on the 1904 list can vote at the presidential election this fall and all special elections without again registering.
