Now the question arises will the people of Oregon be benefited as much by the exposition at Portland as they would be by the same amount of money being systematically in the construction of good public roads, well graded and macadamized so the different counties of Oregon. The writer is in favor of all laudable enterprises. This is no hobby; it is a vital question and one that appeals to every taxpayer in Jackson county. And like Blancoes ghost, will not down but trails at the heels of every one who walks, rides or drives on our common hard roads. To construct good permanent public roads requires money, labor and brains, either one being powerful as without the other. We have as good and competent county board as we could select, but they are helpless without the means to do with. The work of constructing good roads be systemized just as other public works and railroads and canals are constructed either by contract or under the supervision of a competent overseer. Now is it not a favorable time to agitate the question.
