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The semiannual examination for teachers for Jackson county will be held by Supt. P. H. Daily at the court house in Jacksonville to begin at 9 a. m. on Wednesday, August 10 and continue for three days.

W. R. Stansell came home Wednesday from Sardine creek, where he has recently put in operation his saw mill which he moved from Coleman creek, to spend a couple of days with his family and to attend to some business matters. Mr. Stansell stated that he now had the mill running on full time and has a crew of 15 men in the mill and the woods. Francis Nelson is sawyer and David Day is engineer, the crew being largely the same men who worked for him on Coleman creek. Mr. Stansell is doing his own logging and uses trucks to haul the logs to the mill, and the grade being all down hill to the mill makes the hauling an easy job. It will be a month yet before he will have lumber hauled to the railroad for shipment as it is necessary that the lumber be seasoned to make it light weight so that the freight charges will be low. He will ship from Gold Hill for the present but hopes to get the railroad company to put in a switch at Rock Point, that place being nearer to his mill than Gold Hill.

The report of the warden of the Oregon penitentiary for the quarter ending June 30, shows that the number of prisoners has increased from 314 to 334 in the last three months. During the quarter 56 were received, 33 discharged, one died and 2 transferred to the asylum. The earnings of the institution were: For board of United States prisoners, \$531.42; for convict labor in stove foundry, \$398.90; for convict labor on public roads, \$526.20; for team on public roads, \$264.25. The salary account for the quarter was \$5,590.05, and the expense for maintenance \$7,527.19. From the betterment fund \$688.10 was spent for improvements. Other expenditures brought the total expense for the quarter up to \$15,462.89.

Mr. J. C. Pendleton, of Table Rock, formerly assessor of Jackson county, in company with his wife, drove to the Pass Wednesday, with a fine matched team of young horses. Mr. and Mrs. Pendleton have many friends at Grants Pass, he having been for many years connected with the Southern Oregon Agricultural Fair. Mr. Pendleton has a fine farm and incidentally raises some nice stock. He sold his team to John Ranzau before he left for home Thursday. We congratulate Mr. Ranzau on his purchase, for he has undoubtedly one of the best road teams in the county.—Oregon Mining Journal.
