For "Good Roads" In This Country.

County Commissioner J. Patterson and Jack True, foreman of the county rock crusher crew, returned Friday from Salem where they attended the State fair and witnessed the building of a sample section of macadamized road which was built at the fair grounds jointly by the Fair Association, Marion County and the Southern Pacific Railroad Company. The work was done under the supervision of J. W. Abbott of the bureau of good roads of the Department of Agriculture, and was a demonstration of the best methods of modern road building. It created much interest and there were a large number of "good roads" men present from all parts of the state and the information gained will do much toward advancing the "good roads" movement in Oregon and of securing more practical and permanent methods of road building. Messrs. Patterson and True feel that the information they gained well repaid them for the expense of the trip and as they are both enthusiasts in the effort to secure a system of modern roads for Jackson county, it is quite certain there will be a decided improvement in the manner of expending the county road fund that will give better results than has been the misfortune of Jackson county in the years past, which is quite certain of accomplishment in view of the fact that Judge Dunn and Commissioner Brown are also strong "good roads" advocates, and now the tax-payers may expect road work that will not be a repetition of repair work year after year with no permanent work to show for the large sums of money expended.

The "Yellow Jacket" Quartz Mine.

Frank Shaffer, who with Harry Meares are the owners of the Yellow Jacket ledge on Forest creek, which they bought two years ago of Alex Orme and J. W. McIntyre, was in Jacksonville Tuesday. Mr. Shaffer stated that he and his partner are pushing development work on their ledge and now have a crosscut tunnel in 160 feet from which a drift extends 197 feet along the ledge. They have a shaft sunk 90 feet, and as there is but 20 feet of connection to be made between the drift and the shaft they intend to do that in the near future so that an air circulation can be had and the mine be put in shape for stoping out ore. They expect to do considerable more development work this winter and if their ledge continues the splendid showing now made they will put a five or ten stamp mill in, in the spring. The Yellow Jacket is located in Cougar gulch on the west side of Forest creek, half a mile from the Olmstead store at the Nance-Sturgis mine. This ledge is one of the most promising ledges in the Jacksonville district, both as to quantity and quality of ore and there is every likelihood that it will become a profitable property.
