Annual Methodist Episcopal Conference For Oregon Makes Many Changes In Pastors and In Southern Oregon Charges.

REV. A. J. ARMSTRONG COMES HERE

The annual conference for Oregon of the Methodist Episcopal Church which has been in session at Eugene terminated Monday. In the pastoral appointments for the ensuing year Jacksonville and Central Point heretofore in charge of one pastor was made into two charges and Phoenix was attached to Jacksonville and Gold Hill to Central Point. Rev. A. J. Armstrong was given the appointment for Jacksonville and Phoenix and G. L. Burbank the appointment for Central Point and Gold Hill. Rev. Sanford Snyder, pastor for the Jacksonville and Central Point churches for the past year goes to Lakeview. Rev. P. C. Blackwill is given a second year at Medford as is Rev. J. W. McDougall at Grants Pass and Rev. J. F. Abbet at Ashland. Dr. D. T. Summerville who had served the time limit as presiding elder for this district, with his residence at Grants Pass, was given the pastorate of the church at Albany and Rev. M. C. Wire was made presiding elder for this district. Rev. W. B. Noon formerly of Jacksonville and of Medford, but for the past year pastor of the Methodist church at North Yamhill is to have charge of the churches at Oswego and Clackamas, two towns near Portland. Rev. E. B. Lockhart, two years ago pastor of the Jacksonville and Central Point churches is given a second year at Silverton.

The appoints for the various districts were announced Monday by Bishop Spellmeyer of Cincinnati, who presided over the conference.
