## Surety Bonds.

A movement is now on foot in Shasta county, says the Redding Searchlight, for the county officials of Shasta county to give surety company bonds instead of personal bonds, the county to stand the expense of the various premiums.

An act of the last Legislature provides that in case of county officials furnishing bonds of a surety company for the faithful performance of their duties, that the county should bear the expense of the bond.

At present but two of Shasta's officers have surety bonds. They are Assessor Collins and Coroner Besse. They will petition the Supervisors at the next meeting to take advantage of the new law.

If their petition meets with success, and it is claimed that it cannot be successfully denied, officials who now have up personal bonds will change to surety bonds and seek the same support.

Prominent among the personal bonds is that of Treasurer Dennis in the sum of \$90,000. A surety bond in that amount will cost \$150 yearly.

It is claimed for the surety bonds that they are much better for the county, inasmuch as in the case of a defalcation, such as the Jackson shortage, a surety company will pay in full, while it seems impossible to compel personal bondsmen to do so.

## Peach Season Nearing End.

The Ashland Fruit Association is loading a car of Salway peaches today, whose destination is Los Angeles, and which is the second car they have loaded this week. The crop of Salways was never better, either in quality or quantity, than it is this year, and the prices promise to be a little higher than those obtained for the Late Crawfords. The latter variety and the Muirs have been gathered, and the Association's shipment of the two varieties combined were about 15,000 boxes. The 22,000 boxes of Early Crawfords marketed by the Association are being settled for with the growers, and the average prices obtained were for fancies, 62 cents; and for As, 47 cents. Apples are coming in freely and there will be a number of carloads shipped from Ashland, most of which will go to San Francisco and other points south. —Ashland Tidings.
