Proceedings of the Jackson County Court at the Regular Monthly Meeting In October—Considerable Business Transacted.

SCHOOL REPORT FOR SEPTEMBER

At the recent session of the county court a settlement was effected with W. V. Gibbon for damage done to his property by the improvement of the county road near Agate, the supervisor placing the grade off the line of survey and on to land of Mr. Gibbin's. To avoid the necessity of moving the road grade the county bought a strip 12 feet wider and 100 rods long paying for it \$30.

County Surveyor Carl T. Jones and H. von der Hellen and Jas. Owens were appointed a board of road viewers to survey and examine the route for a road petitioned for by Robert A. Neil, et al.

The steam road roller recently bought of the Buffalo Pitts Company of Portland having fully met the guarantee given by the Company, a warrant for \$3500 was ordered drawn in favor of the Company in payment for the roller.

County clerk authorized to secure bids from various county papers for publishing the delinquent tax list.

Application was made by Dr. C. R. Ray for the fixing by the county court of maximum charges for driving and booming logs in Rogue River as provided by law he having been given two years ago a franchise by the county court for the exclusive control and improvement of this stream within the limits of Jackson county. The rate asked for was \$1.50 per thousand feet for driving and 50 cents per thousand feet for booming. As the court was not posted as to whether this was a reasonable rate or not the matter was laid over until the November term while Judge Dunn could ascertain what were the charges allowed by other counties to driving and boom companies for handling logs.

Big Mill to Start Soon.

Milling is shortly to commence at the 30 stamp mill recently erected in the Bohemia district by the Oregon Securities Company. In addition to this mill the Company has put in 3,500 feet of cable surface tram, 250 horsepower water electric station, electric motor for under ground work, and a compressor and drills and 5000 feet of air pipes, together with the building of 10 miles of heavy mountain road to enable the machinery to be hauled to the mine. A sawmill was erected and lumber cut for the mill, office and residence buildings. This mining plant is one of the largest and most complete in Western Oregon and its success will give a big impetus to development of the mining industry in this section of the state.
