

# Mines and Miners,

Of Southern Oregon.

Stock in the famous Homestake mine have recently climbed from \$43. to \$67. per share. The company recently refused a \$35,000,000 offer from an English syndicate.

The Mt. Pitt Mining Co. have been operating their two 12 ft. arastras during the past two weeks on low grade ore with good results. The beds of the pits are now worked smooth and the crevices filled. Work will be continued on a better grade of ore.

C. F. Mangum together with Dr. J. F. Reddy, Patsy Clarke, and one of Mr. Clarke's mining experts left first of the week for Mr. Mangum's mine, "Old Glory," on Silver creek says the Grants Pass Journal. These gentlemen have thoroughly investigated this property while here, and should the report of the expert be satisfactory a sale may be the result.

The lucky Briggs family are not resting on the outcome of their bonanza, now under bond for \$100,000, but have gone after more of the same kind. Up near the Curry county line, on upper Chetco they have located a claim on a rich ledge which, though it cannot compare with the wonderful wealth of the Wounded Buck claim, shows exceedingly good values.

W. C. Kitto came into town Wednesday night of this week and left for Jacksonville Thursday morning. Mr. Kitto was formerly employed on the Granite Hill mine, but is now foreman at the Oregon Belle near Jacksonville, under the management of Foster and Gunnell of this city. Mr. Kitto reports developments at the Oregon Belle as very satisfactory.—Grants Pass Journal.

The new road from the Greenback mine to the S. P. Company's line is now finished and the old road by way of Leland has been abandoned says the Grants Pass Herald. The new road come in and besides working a much easier grade than the old one saves about four miles in distance. The new road follows down Coyote creek from Golden to Wolf Creek station.

A Carload of specimen ore for exhibition at the Lewis and Clark Fair has been shipped from this place says a dispatch from Gold Hill dated Dec. 1. An agent of the state commission is busy gathering representative rock and has found the miners of this state very responsive to his request. Many specimens are included in the exhibit that will advertise Gold Hill's mineral resources.

Superintendent C. W. Geddes and wife came down from the Blue Ledge mine last Thursday, and Friday went on down to Medford where they remained over Sunday. Mr. Geddes states that when he left the mine, which is high up in the Siskiyou, there was no snow and the weather was balmy and warm, much more so than it was here last Friday night when we had the first killing frost of the season.

The Eagle mine, 2 miles south of town one of the best paying properties in this camp, was on Monday last, sold by its owners Dr. James Braden and John D. Graham, to New York parties, for \$14,000.00 says the Gold Hill News. The new owners have possession and will push development work to a finish, under E. W. Liljegren, the local manager with his office in Gold Hill, and who is one of the best mining men in the country. Work will commence at once and under Mr. L's. management, will of course, be heard from.

H. R. Smith formerly with the Greenback mine near Grants Pass, has accepted a position at the Opp mine. He will become a resident of our city and is but one of a number of men to arrive here this week and become permanent residents.

We hear Dr. Ray has stuck a fine prospect on the McDonough place where he may install a large dredger. At the dam they are prepared to receive 600,000 logs enroute down the river. A day and night crew are busy completing the new power house.—Gold Hill News.

The big 40-stamp mill of the Lucky Boy mine in the Blue River district is now running smoothly and producing almost \$100,000 a day. There are many new mills now being erected in this district and ere long there will be many good producers there besides the big Lucky Boy.

District Attorney A. E. Reames and his estimable wife left Monday evening for Grants Pass, where they will proceed to drive to the Waldo district where Mr. Reames is interested in the Deep Gravel Mining Co. which is beginning its winter's run with giants. They will remain there a week or ten days before returning home.

Operations on diggings of the Deep Gravel Mining company, owned by W. J. Wimer and A. E. Reames, have been opened full blast says a recent dispatch from Waldo. Last season's work took the pit into a deeper channel of pay gravel, from which the company realized its best profits of recent years. By means of the No. 2 Hendy hydraulic elevator and the long flume work is prosecuted to bedrock, where there is a depth of more than 40 feet. Pay gravel is said to go to this depth, and bed rock in some places is not found in less than 70 feet. The management has put everything in condition for a long run, and the clean-up will no doubt be the best ever made by the Deep Gravel property, which was formerly known as the Wimer diggings.
