$\$ 5,000,000$. Though covering 405 acres of land and natural lake, it will be com pact in form, and the average person will be able to see and comprehend it all in a few days at moderate cost. The cream of the foreign and domestic exhibits to be
made at $S$. Louis this year will be trans ferred to Portland at the close of the Louisiana Purchase Exposition. The
United States exhibit will be moved entire to Portland and installed in building to be specially erected. This exhibit will be will have many features which will not be seen at St. Louis, such as exhibit demonstrating the life, customs and industries of China, Japan, Hawaii, Siberia, Russia, Alaska, Australia, New Zealand, the Phil ppines and India.
The Lewis and Clark Centennial will be the first international exposition under
