The quilt, claims Mrs. Saunders, is the handiwork of a woman who resided in Cortland county, New York in the Revolutionary period. This woman danced with General Washington at many social functions, and during the strife between King George's and Washington's forces, distinguished herself by melting her valuable pewter for use as bullets.

Washington, it is said, wore the quilt through the war, and its folds are said to have protected him from the intense cold at Valley Forge.
