Friends of Senator Fulton say that they have it on good authority that he will make the most vigorous fight against Heney and that he will not tamely submit to what he terms "malicious, vindictive and wholly unfounded falsehoods."

Announcement was made of the resignation, to take effect February 15, of First Assistant Postmaster General Frank H. Hitchcock, who will henceforth take hold of the Taft campaign, with headquarters at Washington.

For 13 days Dr. W. A. Egbert, a practicing physician of Spokane was asleep. After 48 hours, believed to be dying he was watched by a nurse and a relative. But he came of his slumbers with a clear vision, a good appetite and in healthy condition.

Acting under instructions from President Roosevelt, Francis J. Heney is looking up the record of Thomas J. Cleeton, who has been recommended by the Oregon delegation in Congress for appointment as United States district attorney to succeed W. C. Bristol.

Will Irwin, the California author and poet, is being sued for divorce in San Francisco on the ground of desertion. His wife who was Harriet Sophia Hyde, sister of Helen Hyde, the artist, also asks for \$150 a month alimony. The Irwins were students together at Stanford University, were married in 1898 and have one child.

W. S. Rossiter, appointed Acting Public Printer vice Stilling, went to the Treasury Department to have his bond approved. The department refused to consider the matter, on the ground that the President had exceeded his authority in appointing Mr. Rossiter; that under the law Associate Public Printer Captain H. T. Brain succeeds to the vacancy.

Three of the shrewdest political observers in the country, men who have had years of experience in National campaigns, after two weeks canvass and conference at the expense of the Washington Post, predict the nomination of Governor Hugnes. Their analysis of the ballots at the convention for the Pacific coast shows: Oregon—four for Hughes and four for Taft; Washington—four for Hughes and six for Taft; Idaho—six for Taft.

Marion county Republicans will hold a county convention as in the days before the direct primary was adopted. This much was decided at a conference of Republican leaders last Monday night. While the meeting was not publicly announced and its conclusions are not necessarily binding upon the party, yet it is believed that those present represented the general sentiment of the Republicans of the county and that there will be no strong dissent. The sentiment was unanimous in favor of a county convention and equally unanimous against the signing of Statement No. 1 by Republican candidates for the Legislature.
