MISS EVA BOOTH.

Preparing For the Greatest Campaign
In History of Salvation Army.

Evangeline Booth, head of the Salvation Army in America, is preparing for the greatest campaign in the history of that great organization in the United States.

It is to be a campaign for humanity, a nation wide movement in anticipation of approaching winter to provide shelter for homeless men, to care for poor and unfortunate women, to rescue starving children and to provide Christmas dinners for tens of thousands of poor people who otherwise would know of no such cheer.

Nobody who is acquainted with the characteristics of Evangeline Booth for a moment doubts that she will accomplish this and more. A slight little

body she is, yet possessed of all the tremendous nerve force and executive ability which have so long distinguished her venerable father, still active in his seventy-ninth year, the founder of the Salvation Army, General William Booth.

Sixteen hours a day she labors and frequently eighteen, and no wonder, for she is commander in chief of an army consisting of tens of thousands of soldiers quartered in 903 barracks or churches. Last year the meetings conducted by them were attended, it is claimed, by more than 7,000,000 persons.

She is at the head of a great system of industrial homes and Salvation Army hotels, which have fed 1,318,000 men and furnished beds, either free or at a nominal price, to 463,000 homeless men. The 116 rescue homes last year cared for more than 9,000 women.

In addition to all this Miss Booth manages the publication of the official paper of the Salvation Army, the War Cry, of which no fewer than 4,124,000 copies were sold last year.

Manicuring the Nails.

The fashionable nail just now is the brilliantly polished one that looks very glossy indeed. It is cut to fit the shape of the finger. If the finger is long and pointed the nail is cut long and pointed, but if the finger is round and rather heavy at the end the nail is round.

To train the nails into assuming a pretty shape you must press down skin and flesh at the base of the nail until you can see the half moon. This requires constant attention and must be looked to morning and night without fail or the moons will soon be clouded over again by the skin.

When you push down the flesh be sure that it has previously been softened by holding the hands in a basin of water in which there is a little borax and a pinch of bran; also a tiny bit of soap. The flesh will now be found to be very pliable and can be pushed back by means of a blunt orange wood stick. Never use a sharp instrument for pushing down the skin and flesh at the base of the nails.

Nails that break can be treated so that they will keep their beauty. Every night they should have a little glycerin and rosewater rubbed into them in the proportion of about half and half. If glycerin does not agree with the skin the nail can be treated with vaseline and almond oil, half and half, which can be massaged into the cuticle. This will certainly strengthen the nail and keep it from cracking.

Should the nails be too pale for beauty they can be tinted by massage.
