When Melancthon and his friends were exiled after Luther's death they heard a little girl sing "Ein Feste Burg" in the streets of Weimar. Melancthon said: "Sing on, my child. Thou little knowest how thy song cheers our hearts." In 1870, when the Franco-Prussian war was on, this great German hymn again aroused the German nation. The singing of this hymn has been made the ground for many imprisonments. One group of men arrested for singing it finally escaped and went to England, where they fell in with the great Wesley, and their influence upon him served to bring about the extraordinary Methodist revival.
