The Journal of the Meteorological Society of Japan contains an account by Dr. Okada of the occurrence in Enrea of those remarkable winds which have been called fohn winds. The winds to which this name was originally given are warm winds blowing down from the snowclad mountains of Switserland and producing extensive maitings of the snow. They have been been called "mow eaters." The fohn is essentially a phenomenon of mountainous regions, and Wonsen, in Ecrea, where they have been observed, is carrounded except on the east by high mountains. In this region they are sivery westerly and cause abnormally high temperatures and dryname of the air. A similar wind in North America blowing down from the Rocky mountains has been ealted the chinook. Fohn winds occur aim in the arctic regions. Blowing homethese in midwinter they produce a remarkable climatic parades.
