The Sewing Machine.

The idea of the sewing machine originated in England during the eighteenth century, but as an invention of practical utility it is a product of the nineteenth century and of the United States of America. In 1768 Charles F. Wiesenthal patented a needle in England having an eye in the center and being pointed at both ends, and Robert Alsop in 1770 patented in the same country a device for embroidering with two or more shuttles. In 1790 Thomas Saint took out a patent for sewing cloth and leather, but it was not until Elias Howe (1846) patented the first lock stitch arrangement that the history of the modern sewing machine can be said to have begun.—New York American.
