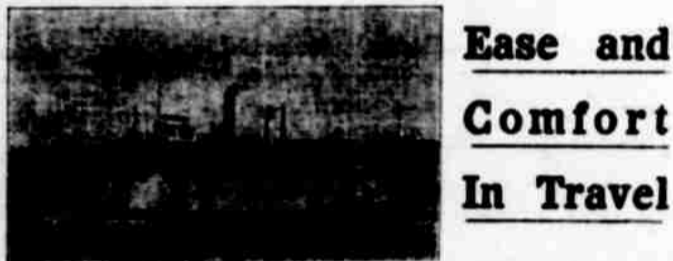

the attention of the Council to the fact that we have a bonded indebtedness falling due within a comparatively short time amounting to \$10,000, and that heretofore no steps have been taken to provide a means of discharging that obligation. It is incumbent upon this Council to devise some way, or rather initiate a policy that will create a fund for the discharge of that obligation—indeed, the contract with the city by which the obligation was assumed, provides that a sinking fund shall be created.

"One of the first matters to come up after the new mayor took his seat was the resignation of A. Castel, from the

First ward. His resignation was accepted, but his successor will not be appointed until the people of that ward have considered whom they want in his place.

As stated last night C. B. Crisler was appointed to fill the vacancy created by the resignation of Mayor Stiltz as councilman from the second ward, and he and Elias Obenchain, F. E. Ankeny and E. T. Sanderson were sworn in as councilmen.

Recorder Leavitt read a statement showing the financial condition of the city. The indebtedness at this time is \$45,000, on which amount the city pays \$2700 interest annually. The Mayor did not outline his policies for raising revenue, but will do so at the next meeting.

With the exception of the special police the appointments were made as stated in the Herald. E. B. Ramsby will hereafter be the only policeman on the night force. If it should become necessary to have two policemen another will be added.

Mayor Stiltz has taken hold of the reins of municipal government with a determination to improve the existing condition. He is a man of public spirit and will give freely of his time to the administration of the city's affairs and during his term he will inaugurate such principles as should result in good for the entire city. As a councilman he served the city well and it is safe to say that as Mayor he will do all that can be expected from a chief executive.
