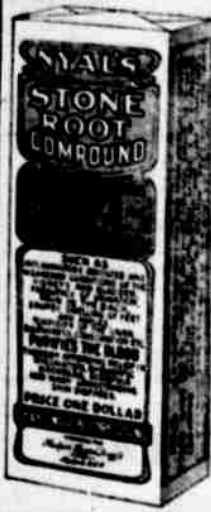

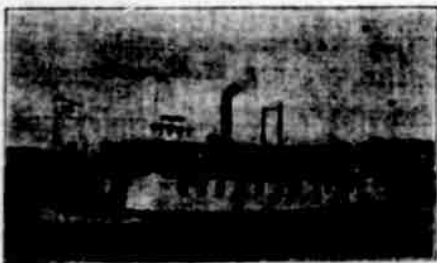

WHY NOT PROGRESS

O. A. Stearns' Opinion On High Street Franchise

To the Herald—

For the second time the common council of Klamath Falls has turned down the franchise for the Keno canal. Last year it was turned down because the property owners on the West Side objected to a large open ditch along the street, and also because the right of way across private property called for such a large portion of the residence lots as to seriously depreciate the values of the property crossed by the ditch. To remove the objectionable features of the open ditch and to bring the damage to the property to the lowest possible point and keep within the money expenditure available for that part of the project, the Reclamation Service made new plans, contemplating the construction of a wooden or concrete flume, 4 feet by 3 feet in dimension, and then asked for ten foot right of way along the street and a twenty foot right of way through the lots south of lot 7 in West Klamath Falls, the flume to be constructed to all crossings and on High street, when opened, so as not to impede travel. Last night the city council laid this franchise on the table refusing to further consider it unless the Reclamation Service officials would change the franchise to call for a "concrete conduit or flume," and until the property owners along the line of the flume had been settled with satisfactorily for rights of way and had been given assurance of a concrete flume or conduit through their premises.

As the property owners objected to a wooden flume on the contention that the leakage would damage their property, Mayor Stilts was asked if the city would grant the franchise for a wooden flume upon an indemnity bond being given by the Water Users' Association, or a number of them agreeing to pay any and all damages such property owners might sustain by reason of such leakage, and he replied that the city would not, but would insist on concrete and settlement with the property owners before granting the franchise.

It is simply holding up the farmers under the project unless they are willing

to let the city dictate what kind of flume shall be built with their money, and that they should accept such property owners as they might feel inclined to impose. Who is standing in the way of improvement and progress, and for what purpose?
