### The Cookbook.

It is better to cook too slowly than too fast.

Cauliflower will be much better and richer if it is boiled in half milk and half water instead of all water.

For creamed cabbage toll the cabbage tender, drain off the water and put into the pot with a large teaspoonful of flour, a tablespoonful of butter, a little salt and half a cupful of milk. Cook, stirring, until the sauce is smooth.

Try steaming an omelet instead of baking or frying it. After the butter has been heated on the pan pour in the omelet and set in a steamer and cover closely. When it is done, brown it over in the oven and serve.

### Home Helps.

Vinegar diluted with water will remove grease from a stove.

Be prompt with home repairs, and the house will look ten times smarter than when little damages are permitted to be in evidence.

A small piece of window glass will be useful for holding the leaves apart on a cookbook, and one can read the recipe and not soil the book by too much handling.

One often hears complaints that the boiler ruls and iron molds the clothes. To prevent this, as soon as the boiler is emptied rub well over with soap. This will not only prevent rust; it will also help to make suds for the next boiling.
