**NEWSPAPER LAW OF OREGON.**—Section 2002 of the laws of Oregon provides that whenever any person controlling a newspaper shall mail such newspaper to any person in this State without first receiving an order therefor, such newspaper shall be deemed to be a gift, and no debt or obligation shall accrue against such person, whether said newspaper is received by the person to whom it is sent or not.

Oregon's next legislature will have 51 Statement No. 1 members instead of 52 as was thought from the first count. The total number of Democrat votes is 14.

The Roesch brewery of La-Grande, one of the largest plants of the kind in eastern Oregon, will be closed on July 1 as a result of the prohibition vote at the recent election. Plans are already on foot to convert the brewery into a fruit packing and storage warehouse.

In spite of the declaration of Judge George Gray that he does not seek the presidential nomination the George Gray League of Delaware has been doing much very aggressive work in his behalf. A force of clerks is now busy mailing 50,000 pamphlets to all parts of the country urging his nomination and setting forth his claims to recognition.

There is one church, anyhow, in Chicago that has a wise man in charge of its affairs. He insists on having a regular fitted up courtship room for the young people, with cozy corners, screens, chaperones and lamps that can be turned away down. He says courtship is essential to happiness and that it is the province of the church to do everything possible for the happiness of its members.

A joint resolution introduced by Senator Owen of Oklahoma inviting the co-operation of the states in the proposed establishment of a national initiative and referendum lies in the hands of the senate committee on privileges and elections. It declares that the co-operation of the states is desired in helping to restore a direct vote system for national questions through the initiative and referendum principle, the ballots and other details at the polls to be provided for by them.

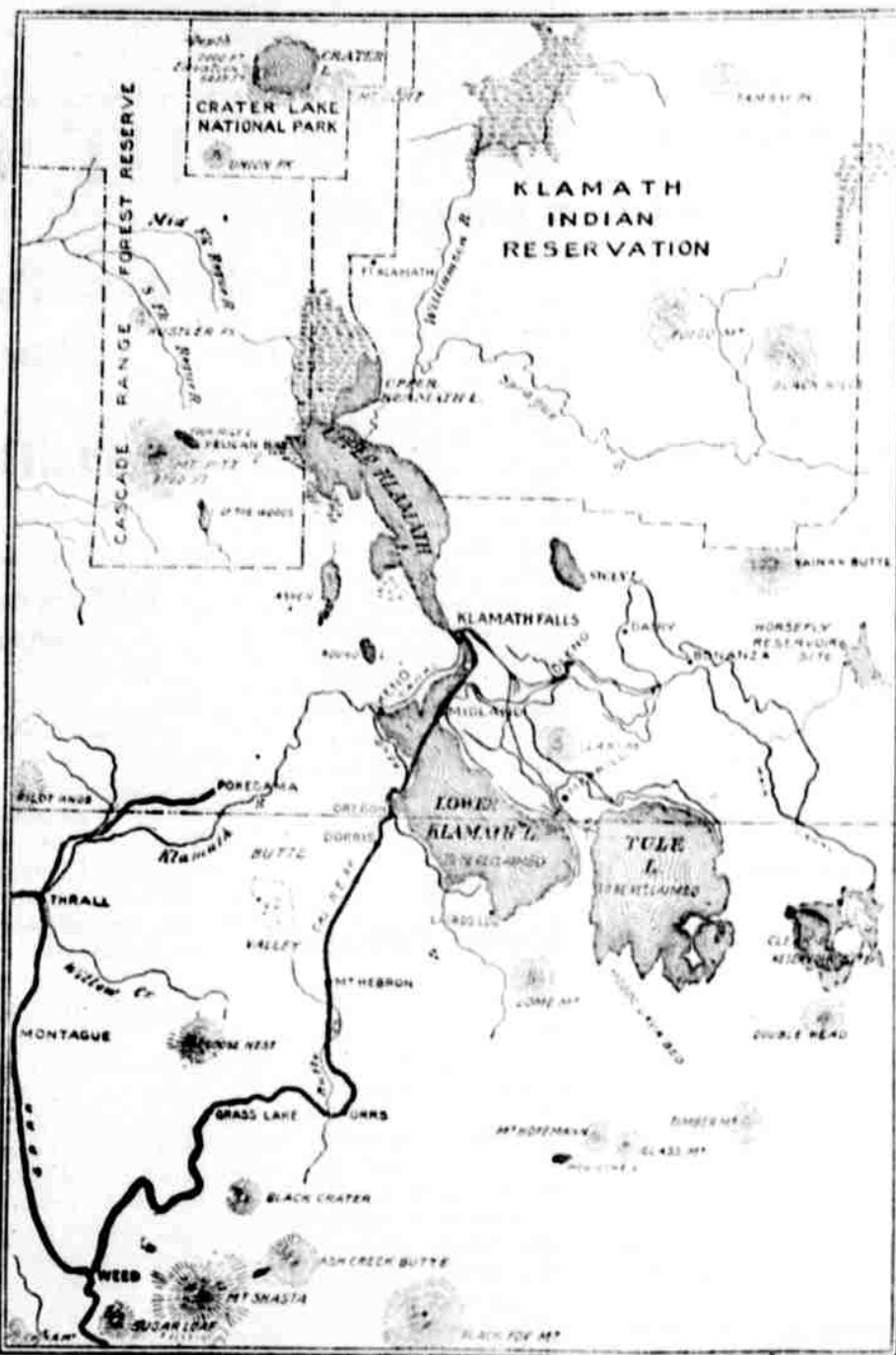

only to license holders. These in brief are the chief points of a plan announced by E. E. Hall of Spokane, a candidate in the Third District for the next legislature of Washington, to solve the liquor question in that State, in which the Republican Party is pledged to local option, while the Democrats are on record as favoring absolute prohibition.

Some of the topics that are printed in the "leave to print" speeches show the trend of mind of different members. Congressman Fordney, of Michigan, cannot keep away from his favorite topic—beet sugar. Foreney has been the greatest champion of beet sugar in congress. One reason why he op-

poses Taft for president is because the secretary wants Philippine sugar admitted free. Congressman French of Idaho has made a strong argument against the government ownership of railroads. Evidently he wants to make that a creed against the Bryan sentiment which is now too prevalent in Idaho. Congressman Rainey, who during the last congress devoted his entire time to an assault upon the watch trust, has now turned upon the "executive usurpation" in the canal zone. He has been pounding the President on this subject with a great deal of vigor. Congressman Reeder of Kansas is an extreme advocate of the forest reserve policy of the present administration. Congressman Goldfogle of New York talks about having the government postal clerks given an opportunity for longer vacations than is at present granted them. Congressman Kimball of Kentucky, as well as several others, discusses the tariff. Congressman Hinshaw of Nebraska printed a speech on the advance of the republic, showing what the American nation had accomplished in recent years. And so it goes with all kinds of topics for there is no "rejected manuscript department" connected with the Congressional Record.

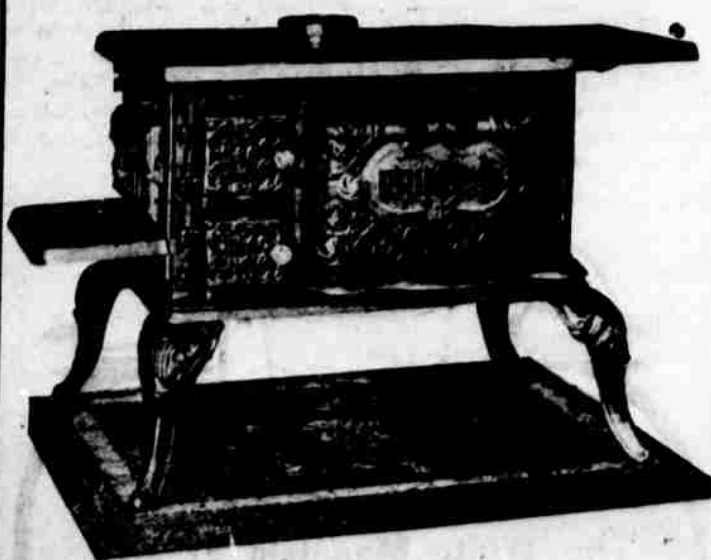
