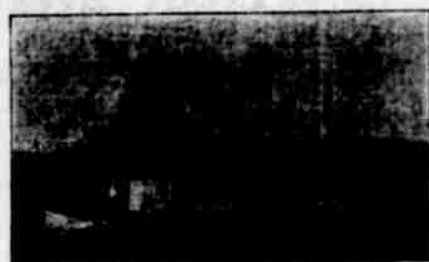

Haines of Brooklyn has received notice that she is to get a pension of \$100 a month from Andrew Carnegie in recognition of her services as managing editor of the Liberty Journal of New York. She has been editor of the magazine for fifteen years, but has been forced to resign on account of poor health.

### Church and Clergy.

The American Bible society has sent men to work among the foreigners around Indianapolis.

The diamond jubilee of the first church built in Chicago, that of St. Mary's Roman Catholic congregation, will be celebrated June 14.

The Woodlands Road Wesleyan chapel, Middleborough, England, which has just been opened, is provided with "tip up" seats similar to those in use in theaters.

Of a congregation of over a thousand at the First Methodist church of Syracuse, N. Y., only fourteen admitted having been converted after reaching the age of twenty-one.

Grace Methodist church at Dallas, Tex., has a band of twelve uniformed boys who are doing a unique work as messengers in bringing to Sunday school careless and indifferent scholars.

### College and School.

Harrow, one of the four greatest public schools of England, was founded in 1571.

The operating expenses of Columbia university for the present year are \$1,552,563.

Dr. Robert C. Brooks, Joseph Wharton professor of economics at Swarthmore college, has resigned to accept the chair of political science at the University of Cincinnati.

Professor John H. Nlemeyer, Street professor of drawing in the Yale Art school, will retire on a pension at the end of the present college year as professor emeritus. The only other professor at Yale to retire as emeritus at the end of this year is Professor Tracy Peck of the Latin department.

The right of the owner of a dog to maintain an action against one who wantonly and maliciously kills or injures it is sustained in *Columbus Railroad company versus Woolfolk* (Ga.), 10 L. R. A. (N. S.), 1123.
