### NEW OREGON CODE NEEDED

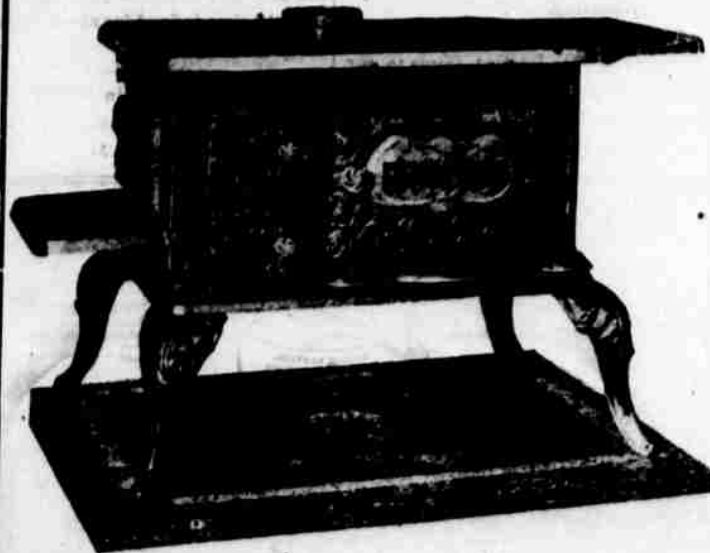
With the people adding numerous new laws under the Initiative and Referendum act, and the edition of the antiquated Bellinger & Cotton code exhausted, the lawyers of the state are throwing up their hands in despair. It is impossible for even the best posted lawyers to act intelligently on the simplest cases without a stupendous amount of work.

The Bellinger & Cotton code is antiquated and not only that but it is out of print. Outside of a few copies in the possession of the secretary of state for the use of the next legislature there are no copies to be had owing to the fact that the plates of the Oregon code were destroyed in the San Francisco fire with the plant of the Bancroft-Whitney company. At the time of the last session of the legislature it was said that there were less than 50 new copies of the code in existence besides those furnished to the members of the legislature for their use during the session. It is a question therefore whether there will be copies enough to go round at the 1909 session, owing to the fondness shown for the big books by the members of the legislature, the majority of whom took their books home instead of returning them to the secretary of state.

Aside from the fact that the code is out of print is the further argument in the hands of the attorneys that the Bellinger & Cotton edition is antedated. Since it was compiled five or six sessions of the legislature have intervened and several initiative elections have been held so that perhaps the majority of the statutes have been amended, some of them more than twice, others have been repealed and again enacted by subsequent legislatures in different forms, until the lawyer looking for a statute has to go through not only his code but different volumes of session laws to find the exact statute of any law.

Goaded by the condition which confronts them daily in the practice of the law the members of the state bar association, are planning to advance upon the legislature next January and demand redress and surcease from unnecessary tribulation, worry and work. The state association will have an annual meeting some time during the late summer and fall and then the matter will be given full discussion and a plan of campaign will be mapped out. According to the present program the association will ask the legislature for a code commission to revise the laws of the state and put them in good and convenient form.

**RESTORATION TO ENTRY OF LANDS IN**  
 National Forest.
