**Garibaldi.**  
 Garibaldi died on the island of Capri June 2, 1882, at the age of seventy-five. Garibaldi made no fame as a writer. After 1870 he wrote two or three novels, but they were very mediocre productions and created but little stir in the world.

**Snakes.**
