Eighty acres of oil land near Midway, Kern county, sold Monday for \$100,000.

State Senator McNeil of Connecticut is still quite a favorite in the vice-presidential field. It is even said that the big New York delegation may be thrown for him. If New York should vote for McNeil for vice-president, which is possible, for anything is possible with the New Yorkers in the Democratic national convention, it will be a long step in the direction of his nomination.

There might be something to the Charles A. Towne vice-presidential boom if it is a fact that the Bryan people have despaired of doing anything with William R. Hearst and expect his opposition during the campaign. Hearst and Towne have differences that cannot easily be reconciled and if he is put on the ticket with Bryan, will mean that Hearst can be considered in opposition to the ticket. Friends of Bryan who have seen him within a few days think Bryan has absolutely cut loose from Hearst and expects his opposition.

#### RESTORATION TO ENTRY OF LANDS IN NATIONAL FOREST
